Bursary Payments

Outreach Activities

Non residential summer school

In partnership with Aimhigher Sussex the University will host a non residential Summer Screen Event for approximately 70 Year 9 students from schools across the West Sussex Region. There will be opportunities for students to take part in drama and dance activities as well as having access to the media technology available to produce a DVD of the event. Working with staff and students from the University the school students will experience first hand what its like to be a University student.

Cross curricular event for local schools

The University will host a cross curricular activity for approximately 100 Year 7 pupils from 7 secondary schools in the local area. Some activities will take place

Working with its HE partners in Sussex the University of Chichester will seek to promote the opportunities of higher education with Local Authority departments

Participation from State Schools or Colleges

Chichester is not proposing to increase or reduce its percentage recruitment from State Schools or Colleges but will aim to maintain it at its current level 98pc as it is already better than the benchmark 94pc and the location adjusted benchmark 92pc .

Participation from NS SEC classes 4 5 6 and 7

The University has recently achieved its location adjusted benchmark 29pc and as this is one of the two main areas that bursaries will be targeted at Chichester will strive to achieve the benchmark 34pc over the next few years.
